

Virtual Collection of Masterpieces (VCM)

100 museums in the VCM Network!

The Bago Archeological Museum (Myanmar) has joined the VCM and with that became the 100th museum of the network! This fantastic milestone has been reached thanks to the enthusiasm of 57 Asian and 43 European museums.

Altogether, our participants have contributed approximately 2000 Asian masterpieces. These objects, although physically far apart and dispersed in museum collections all over the Eurasian continent, are now brought together in the virtual world. Besides the objects database, the VCM also features exhibitions and research projects from its participating museums. Curators of these museums provided the texts accompanying the images.

The VCM is a flagship project of the Asia Europe Museums network (ASEMUS) and is financially supported by museums that strongly believe in intercultural cooperation. Its leading partners are the National Museum of Korea and the Museum Volkenkunde (National Museum of Ethnology) of the Netherlands.

Now on view: the VCM widget

The VCM is the first virtual collection in the world to offer a 'widget'. The widget allows you to view a new major work of Asian art from the VCM collection on your desktop and on your mobile phone every day. The title of the work, where and when it was made, the museum to which it belongs and a link to the full description of the masterpiece appears with a simple click of the mouse. The VCM intends to use a number of innovative products to reveal its collection in various ways, and it considers the widget to be one



such product. It goes without saying that the widget's ultimate purpose is to entice people to visit the VCM website and marvel its masterpieces collection.

The VCM widget can be found on your PC desktop, iGoogle, Mac Dashboard Widget, Windows mobile and Iphone.

Story to discover: the Hidden Base of Borobudur




Borobudur in Central Java is one of the most spectacular monuments of the Buddhists and of mankind. In 1885, an amazing discovery was made: the stones of the lowest terrace masked a set of160 wonderful reliefs depicting the law of cause and effect, earth, heaven and hell. This series of reliefs, known as "the Hidden Base of Borobudur", were photographed by Kasian Cephas in the 1890's before being covered again. Cephas' photographs constitute a unique and invaluable testimony.

The VCM is proud to present, for the first time in digital form, the full series of reliefs from Borobudur's Hidden Base, accompanied by an interactive map and an analysis by Dr. Nandana Chutiwongs (National Museum of Ethnology, Leiden, The Netherlands).

The Silk Road project

In 2010 four museums and four school classes in four different countries were involved in a pilot project for the Learning Zone. The Chester Beatty Library in Dublin, the Asian Civilisation Museum in Singapore, the National Folk Museum in Seoul and Museum Volkenkunde (National Museum of Ethnology) in Leiden invited school groups to participate in a program about the Silk Road. The four museums partially delivered the input for the Learning Zone: they will provide a manual and examples for other VCM members to start a Silk Road program in their own museum.



Thanks to the financial contribution of these four partner museums and of the Dutch VSB Funds, the Silk Road satellite website will be launched in November 2011.
